The Club Padlocks

Always lock them on to gates & scramble the combination when you visit the club no matter how long you intend to be. It's so easy to get distracted whilst at the club & it only takes a few seconds for someone to walk off with one.

Please Remember!

Lock & Scramble our padlocks at all times.

If it's not scrambled, the thief gets a free padlock & the current code to our club gates.



Look after me, I'm quite expensive! I need to be locked onto something or I might wander off.

Advice from Essex Police

We have to take responsibility for our own property. If you leave items (particularly engines) in the dinghy park at any time you should be aware that they are at a very high risk.

- 1. Remove temptation wherever possible.
- 2. Padlocks & alarms have been fitted to the container storage & electrical supply box.
- 3. CCTV warning signs have been fitted to gates/entrances around the club perimeter.
- 4. A range of defensive planting has been installed in order to hamper access via side fencing.
- 5. The combination padlocks are reprogrammed regularly.

- 7. Engine covers can be purchased & fitted to your craft. (See details below)
